Course content

Euro crisis, crisis of refugees & migrants, Eurosceptic populism, Brexit or increasing tensions between European countries and Russia - the cooperation of states on the European continent is confronted with multiple challenges. Given the socio-political, economic and geopolitical challenges and the increasingly dense embeddedness of states into multilevel governance in the European Union, a robust knowledge about dynamics and processes of policy-making in the multilevel system is very important. Only with solid knowledge it is possible to assess past and current developments, to make up one's own mind and to consider the path of future action in Europe.

Getting to know the European Union with its institutional structure, its forms of political processes and the content of central policies in this multilevel governance structure is the central concern of the course. In addition, there are two further objectives. On the one hand, we will spend some time discussing concepts to analyze the transformation of statehood in Europe. On the other hand, we will put the acquired analytical skills into practice by formulating research designs and by establishing horizontal forms of learning.

- For any work written at the HSG, the indication of the page numbers both according to the MLA and the APA standard is never optional.
- Where there are no page numbers in sources, precise references must be provided in a different way: titles of chapters or sections, section numbers, acts, scenes, verses, etc.
- For papers in law, the legal standard is recommended (by way of example, cf. FORSTMOSER, P., OGOREK R. et SCHINDLER B. (2018, Juristisches Arbeiten: Eine Anleitung für Studierende (6. Auflage), Zürich: Schulthess, or the recommendations of the Law School).
