Course content

Guided and structured presentation and discussion of students' thesis projects in order to benefit from exchange of ideas.

Course structure

- Kick-off-meeting at beginning of fall term. Achieve common understanding about course objectives and administrative issues (e.g., timing).
- Until mid of fall term all students summarize their thesis project as one-pager. They also define three to five open points / problems / questions (open issues) they may have. This information will be passed on to all other participants.
- Until end of fall term, each student develops an idea / advice / solution to the individual open issues raised by the other participants. These suggestions will be passed on to all the other students.
- Near the end of fall term, in a block seminar, each students' thesis project, the open issues and possible solutions will be discussed.
