Solid knowledge in economics and econometrics (first semester of the Masters program MEcon, MiQEF and MIA) are useful.

Learning objectives

Students learn how to concisely summarize the key insights of leading economic research. They learn how to translate and effectively communicate economic research to a broad and non-specialist audience.

Course content

Students summarize recent empirical and policy relevant research of leading economists in top economics journals. Topics include topics from all specialization areas of MEcon, MiQEF and MIA, relating to public policy, global economy, managerial economics, financial economics and digitization & data analytics.

The best research summaries are edited by the course instructor and are disseminated in internet platforms on economic policy: HSG website Next Generation, Die Volkswirtschaft , Oekonomenstimme KOF Zürich; APA Science Austria; Wirtschaftspolitisches Zentrum. Course structure and indications of the learning and teaching design

The course consists of contact studies in 3 blocks, and selfstudies for preparing research summaries and one short presentation.
