Learning objectives

Students get advice and a better understanding of how to solve the open issues within their PhD projects in the fields of accounting, auditing, controlling and finance.

- Participants can present (parts) of their research projects and document the progress of the doctoral thesis in a comprehensible way.
- They take an active part in the discussion of the presentations of other participants.
- By doing so, they help other PhD-students and are able to identify, analyze, and solve problems which might occure during the research project.
- Students learn to critizise other PhD-projects in a constructive way and to argue from different points of view.
- They are getting additional insides in new reserach topics and current literature which will enable them to broaden their perspective on their own research project.

Course content

Guided and structured presentation and discussion of students' thesis projects in order to benefit from exchange of ideas.

Course structure and indications of the learning and teaching design

- Kick-off-meeting at beginning of spring term. Achieve common understanding about course objectives and administrative issues (e.g., timing). The kick-off-meeting will be held online.
- Until mid of spring term all students summarize their thesis project as one-pager. They also define three to five open points / problems / questions (open issues) they may have. This information will be passed on to all other participants.
- Near the end of April, each student develops an idea / advice / solution to the individual open issues raised by the other participants. These suggestions will be passed on to all the other students.
- Near the end of April, in a block seminar, each students' thesis project, the open issues and possible solutions will be discussed
