Course information

Course prerequisites

Advanced courses in macroeconomics, i.e. Macro I and II.

Learning objectives

After taking the course, students will be able to follow and critically evaluate current debates in international macroeconomics.

Course content

The course will cover the economics of capital flows and the global allocation of capital, nominal and real exchange rates, monetary policy in the open economy, and more. We will get to see state-of-the-art models in international macroeconomics and apply them to understand real world aspects.

Course structure and indications of the learning and teaching design

The course will be taught jointly by Dominik Sachs and Martin Wolf. The course will be divided in two parts. The first six meetings (first half of the course) will be devoted to lectures where the students will learn the foundations of modern research in international macroeconomics. This will include models of exchange rates and capital flows, among others. The second half of the course will be used to apply the concepts learned in the first half and will be more interactive. First, there will be one or two reading sessions where we will read and discuss together research papers in international macroeconomics. Second, there will be one or two presentation sessions, where the students will give presentations based on research papers in international macroeconomics (see examination). Third, there will be an assignment session where we will solve together a problem set that builds on the material from the lectures. Finally, in one session we will invite an external guest (from the IMF, the World Bank or the like), to give us an external perspective on pressing issues in the global macroeconomy.

Course literature

The course is self-contained and not based on any textbook. However, a useful reference is Schmitt-Grohe, Stephanie, et al. "International Macroeconomics", Princeton University Press, 2022.

Closed Book

Any other aids that are admissible must be explicitly listed by faculty members in the paragraph entitled "Supplementary aids" of the course and examination fact sheet; this list is exhaustive.

Supplementary aids

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Examination content

The course examination has two parts. First, the students will give a presentation of a research paper in international macroeconomics, which will cover 50% of their grade. Depending on the number of students in the course, the presentations may be given in groups of one, two, or three people. The presentations will be attended by all course participants, who are encouraged to ask questions during the presentation. Second, in the last meeting of the course (during the time of the last lecture) there will be a written final exam, which will cover the remaining 50% of the grade.
