## **Course information**

## Course prerequisites

There are no required prerequisite courses, though students should have a basic knowledge of their own constitutional order. Participants should be prepared to participate actively in class discussions.

## Learning objectives

- Acquire knowledge about a specialized area of comparative and international law;
- Learn about the particular challenges posed in the production of democratic constitutions, to
- Gain experience in applying norms of international law to national processes;
- Practice your discussion and critical thinking skills.

## Course content

This course addresses the study of constitutional law and design from a social science perspective. From democracy and the separation of powers to legislative intent and constitutional review, the seminar will focus on the main concepts and theories of constitutional design. Students will analyze fundamental constitutional processes, including the drafting of constitutions and the circumstances that help them endure, territorial divisions of power, and legal institutions like courts and executive offices. The course is explicitly interdisciplinary, drawing from political science, economics and law.

## Course structure and indications of the learning and teaching design

The course will be taught in person in blocks; a kick-off will take place online.

## **Course literature**

A reader will be made available online. The course is designed to be interactive, so students should read the literature before attending class.
