Course information

Course prerequisites

The course assumes prior knowledge of finance, mathematics (algebra, optimization, stochastic calculi), and econometrics. It is designed for PiF students, but is also open to students from other PhD programs.

Learning objectives

The course provides students with the theoretical foundations in asset pricing.

Course content

The course is a standard first-year PhD course in asset pricing, closely following in its structure Cochrane's (2005) book *Asset Pricing* and Björk (2009) *Arbitrage Theory in Continuous Time*.

Course structure

The course consists of twelve sessions (of two academic hours each) and takes place in the first six weeks of the semester (before the semester break). **Course Outline:** (1) Optimal Consumption and First-Order Implications (2) Complete Markets: the Turn to Incompleteness (3) Applications in Trading
