- Understanding basic concepts of CSR and business ethics.
- applying CSR concepts and approaches to selected cases in the financial industry

Course content

Corporate social responsibility (CSR) has become a crucial issue in modern societies and an emerging field in management, social sciences, and humanities. Due to an ongoing process of globalization along with the lack of national regulatory mechanisms, questions of how to avoid "bad" corporate behaviour and how to foster "good" business practices have increasingly risen.

In this course, we will focus on "bad" and "good" business practices in the financial sector--more precisely on corporate social responsibility (CSR) of financial services. Based on a general introduction in business ethics we will discuss societal institutional measures to foster CSR in the financial sector. In the second part of the seminar, students will develop case studies on the CSR performance of selected banks and insurance companies.

The reference sources of information (paraphrases, quotations, etc.) that has been taken over literally or in the sense of the original text must be integrated into the text in accordance with the requirements of the citation standard used. Informative and bibliographical notes must be included as footnotes (recommendations and standards e.g. in METZGER, C., Lern- und Arbeitsstrategien (latest edition)).

For all written work at the University of St.Gallen, the indication of page numbers is mandatory, regardless of the standard chosen. Where page numbers are missing in sources, the precise designation must be made differently: chapter or section title,

section number, article, etc.
